#### **Building Work**

We have had a lot of structural work done to the school during the summer holiday. A new lobby and office have been created to the front of the school and we have had a new fire detection system installed throughout the school. Please bear with us as final 'tweaks' are completed!

#### Exceptional Circumstances Absence Forms

This policy is in line with other local schools. The government's minimum expectation for a normal child to be in school is 95%. Some of our children have term time holidays and then also have time off ill during the year, hence their attendance percentage is poor. Whilst we understand that children are going to be ill, taking your child away on holiday during term time causes them to miss vital learning and may impact on the progress they make.

Leave can only be granted for 'very exceptional circumstances'. Sometimes having frequent 'odd' days

Leave can only be granted for 'very exceptional circumstances'. Sometimes having frequent 'odd' days absence can be as disruptive for your child as taking blocks of time off.

#### Please note:

- There is no right to leave or occasional days off during term time.
- Any leave taken <u>without approval in advance</u> will automatically be marked as 'unauthorised absence'.
- Unauthorised absences are reviewed by the DfE and may be referred to the Education Welfare Officer.
- Exceptional Circumstance Absence request forms are available from the school office. Completed forms should be returned and each case will be treated on an individual basis.

#### Air Ambulance Clothing Bank

Don't forget we have a Clothing Bank installed on site in aid of the Leicestershire Air Ambulance.

The container is placed at the end of the path in front of the school hall.

#### Breakfast and After School Club

Forms for this provision are available from the school office.

All 'Active 5' sessions will now take place in the school hall. Access to the school is via the pedestrian gate on Coppice Lane. Please park all vehicles on the main road and **not** Coppice Lane.

Please collect your children from the main front door.

Parents should not turn into the staff car park at anytime.

Children should take all their belongings to the After School Club as there will be no access to classrooms at the end of the day.

#### Daily collection and dismissal procedures for pupils.

Children will be welcomed into school from their external classroom doors at 8.50am each morning by their class teacher. Families arriving before this are asked to stay together in the relevant playground. Pupils who come to school alone will not be supervised until this time and we would strongly recommend that only pupils in Years 5 and 6 are permitted to do this. We would also ask that they do not arrive at school before 8.45am.

At the end of each day children will be dismissed from the same outside doors. Children in Foundation Stage to Year Four will only be permitted to go with somebody aged 17 or over who is known to the school. It is sometimes necessary for someone not known to the school to collect a child and we would ask parents to inform the child's class teacher of this as soon as possible.

Children in Years 5 and 6 who wish to go home alone will need a consent form completed each year by their parent.

#### Glossary for new parents!

When you look at the calendar at the end of this newsletter there may be some events which you may not be clear about! Please see one of the staff if you have any queries.

GOLDEN BOOK ASSEMBLY: This is happens every Friday. Children from each class are chosen by their class teacher to go in the 'Golden Book'. Parents of these children are sent a text the day before, inviting them to attend this special assembly.

**STAR OF THE MONTH:** One child from each class is nominated to have Afternoon Tea with Mrs. Hardy! They receive a special invitation by post.

#### Late collection!

Whilst we understand that parents may be delayed in exceptional circumstances when collecting your child after school, some children are repeatedly collected late. Children are placed unsupervised in the library if this happens. We now have a procedure to ensure the safety of your children.

On the second occasion of your child being collected more than 10 minutes late, you will receive a letter informing you, that should this happen again during the term, your child will be placed into After School Club and you will incur the full costs of the club.

# Water

#### A Reminder!

Children have the opportunity to drink water at times allocated throughout the day. Children are only allowed to drink juice with their lunch. Please ensure children in KS1 &2 have a water bottle in school each day.

Foundation Stage are offered cups of water throughout the day.

Key Stage 1 and Foundation Stage children have a piece of fruit provided for them each day for break under the Free Fruit Scheme for Schools. Children in Key Stage 2 are encouraged to bring a piece of fruit or vegetable for their morning break. Fruit bars or similar are NOT allowed.

#### PE KIT

Please ensure your child has a PE kit in school at all times!

White round necked T-shirt, black/navy shorts and plimsolls.

Swimming kit & hats for children using our own pool (for boys and girls).

Children must change their shoes for PE.
Foundation Stage children will not need PE shoes
initially.

Plimsolls are required for indoor PE.
Children from **Yr 2-6** must have trainers for outside and **not** plimsolls or AstroTurf boots.
No football shirts or similar allowed.

KS2 children will require a black/navy tracksuit with no logos for outdoor PE in the winter.

Earrings should not now be worn in school.

Please arrange for ears to pierced over the summer break so allowance is made for the initial mandatory 6 weeks.

A drawstring sports bag is needed to keep kit in at school. No backpacks due to limited space in cloakrooms.

#### SUITABLE CLOTHING



Your child must have a waterproof coat and suitable shoes to go outside in wet weather. We take children outdoors to play in ALL

weather except in exceptional circumstances.

Children are expected to wear uniform at all times.

Long hair must be tied back. (Boys & Girls!)

No 'flamboyant' hair accessories please!

Please ensure that shoes are suitable for school.

(School shoes or black trainers) Shoes with higher than normal heels are not allowed.

They are dangerous around school and could cause unnecessary accidents.



#### Financial Commitments this term

#### PARKING

In order to reduce congestion on the main road, please could we request that parents do not park on both sides of the road creating a single track carriageway. Please could we trial **ALL** parents parking on the Methodist Church side of the road and not on the side right next to the school.

Parents are reminded that we request that you **DO NOT** turn into Coppice Lane because of Health and Safety issues.

Please could we also request that parking does not take place on the hashed lines near the Crossing Patrol. Local residents frequently complain abut parents using their driveways to turn. We have had several 'near misses' when parents have reversed onto the pavement to turn around. Please spend a few minutes to drive up the village to turn around rather than putting lives in danger. Police are also monitoring dangerous parking around The Ringway.

We recommend that parents park at the Village Hall and walk to the school.
